**Art: On and Indian Summer's Day in the East Side
Kriesberg and Bilander Works on Display**

Walking through the Indian summer along the restfully frantic sidewalks of Madison Avenue proved somewhat more enjoyable than many of the exhibitions that punctuated one's perambulations. But generally speaking, like the debutante at her second party, I'm glad that I went.....

Irving Kriesberg is showing two types of paintings at the Graham Gallery, 1014 Madison Avenue. One is an encyclopedic recitation of animals and objects in compartmented canvases that recall folk and medieval art. More interesting are his larger experiments in color and surface, including one screen with four movable sections. Each segment, painted on both sides, can be swung around to make exactly twenty-four pictures, if I haven't forgotten my permutations. This invitation to the spectator to participate is original and interesting.
